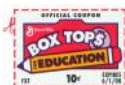

A Reflection of the Gospel from Living Liturgy

2017: While we usually don't think of the three Persons of the Trinity as being for all eternity in a love dance, a Greek term in theology actually tries to capture this. The term is *perichoresis*. It refers to the inner-penetration of the three divine Persons with one another. God, however, is not static but dynamic, is the source of all life, is undiminished love. *Perichoresis* is the music of God's heart evident in the delight of creation.

The Holy Trinity desires that we humans participate in this love-dance. We are destined to be with God now and forever. God chose to create and redeem humanity in an unequalled act of love. The readings this Sunday remind us that God is gracious, sharing divine Life with us: “God so loved” us that God “gave his only Son” so that “the world might be saved.” Yes, God sent the Son so that we might have Life.

The mystery of the Trinity calls us to go both beyond ourselves and deeper into ourselves—to an intimacy with God that delights us and brings us to share that delight with others. Thus is the Trinitarian grace, love, and fellowship manifested in our midst. God is triune mystery, yes! But even more mystery-laden is that God shares divine Self with us in such a gracious manner and “received us” as God's very own.

This gospel posits three possible life-outcomes: might not perish, might have eternal Life, might be saved. These outcomes are why the Father sent the Son. The Spirit empowers us to receive God's love, to believe in the Son, and to yearn for divine Life. But we must *choose* to believe. Do we? We must *choose* to dance. Do we?
