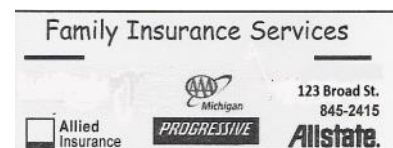

A Reflection of the Gospel from Living Liturgy

2018: In today's gospel we hear an odd-sounding statement about those who are baptized; they will be able to pick up snakes, drink poison without being harmed, and heal the sick by laying hands on them. Aside from a few fundamentalist churches, virtually no Christians take this passage literally. What are we to make of this?

Some Bible stories can appear odd to modern readers. We have to remind ourselves that these vignettes were written about two thousand years ago by people who lived in the ancient world. It can be challenging to discern theological meaning from some of the Bible's stories. And yet, we are to do just that. We do not read the Bible literally, but we read it as thinking Christians, with the guidance of the church, our community of fellow believers. To assist us with this endeavor, the church provides us with translations of Bible that include extensive notes. Part of our living the paschal mystery is to encounter the Scriptures as thinking adults. And we are grateful to have so many resources for us in today's age for that very task.

More than anything else, the gospel today tell us that Jesus is with God in heaven.
